

What is the course about?

ALN provides one-to-one teaching in evening classes around the Island. We use volunteer tutors, who are trained to provide tuition in English and maths. All classes have a Coordinator who ensures that tutors and students are provided with expert guidance and resources.

What are the Entry Requirements?

No formal qualifications are required. A basic assessment will be carried out to ensure that the course is appropriate.

What Subjects will I study?

Tuition focuses on English or maths. Study is very much 'student led', so if a student has area of difficulty (form-filling or reading questions in the Driving Theory Test, for example) we can focus on this.

How will I be assessed?

Whilst there is no requirement to take exams, many students choose to progress on to Functional Skills English and Maths qualifications. These are qualifications that focus on using English and maths in everyday life situations.

What are my progression and career options?

The most important aspect of ALN is that it builds students' confidence. However, many ALN students do use the course as a stepping-stone to further study, for example taking GCSE courses. The Functional Skills qualifications (see above) are recognised by many employers.
