### What you'll get out of it:

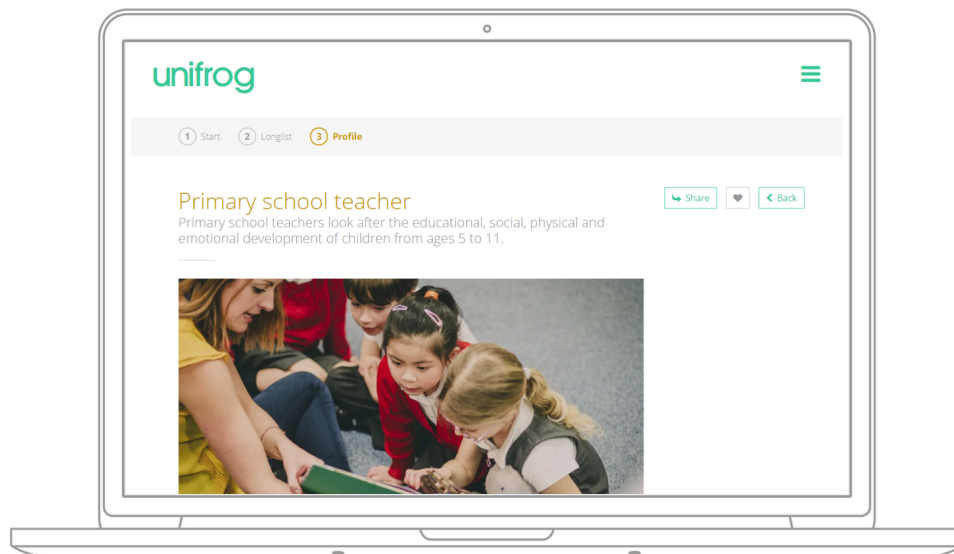
-  Take a deep dive into the teaching profession.

### What is the format of the day?

At 2pm, Get Into Teaching will host a second webinar to round off the day.
