- ✓ Learn how you can create, change and shape the economies around you.

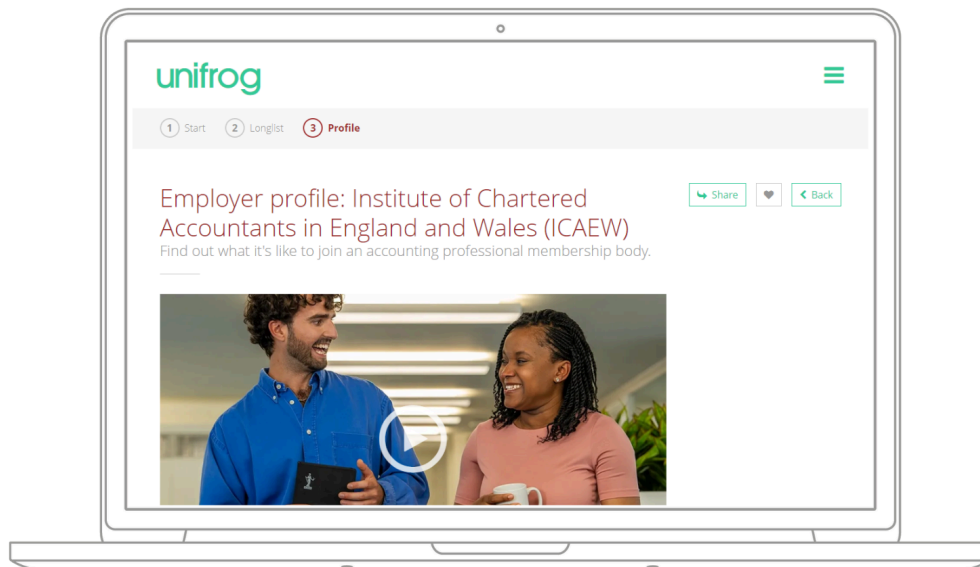


Who it's for:

What is the format of the day?

At 9am, the ICAEW will host a webinar to welcome you to the day and introduce the virtual work experience task they've designed for you.

After the webinar, you'll have time to complete and submit your virtual work experience task, giving you a real taste of the workplace.

At 2pm, the ICAEW will host a second webinar to round off the day.

How do I join the work experience day?

You'll complete this virtual work experience day through our [Courses tool](#). On Monday 1 July, you'll be able to join the course, where you'll find the webinar links and workplace tasks.

The day before the event we'll send you an email reminder with the link to the Course.

In the webinars, will I need to appear on camera or talk on the mic?
