What is the format of the day?

At 9am, the BBC will host a webinar to welcome you to the day and introduce the virtual work experience task they've designed for you.

After the webinar, you'll have time to complete and submit your virtual work experience task, giving you a real taste of the workplace.

At 2pm, the BBC will host a second webinar to round off the day.

How do I join the work experience day?

You'll complete this virtual work experience day through our [Courses tool](#). On Friday 5 July, you'll be able to join the course, where you'll find the webinar links and workplace tasks.

The day before the event we'll send you an email reminder with the link to the Course.

In the webinars, will I need to appear on camera or talk on the mic?

No. You won't appear on camera or talk on the mic, but there might be an opportunity to ask questions through a typed Q&A.

What do I need to take part in the day?

You'll need computer and internet access to watch the webinars. You might do this individually (e.g. with a computer and headphones) or in a group setting (e.g. in a classroom with other students).
